from the Diaconate Formation Office, or during the application meeting, January 28, 2023. Applicants will then be interviewed. Selected applicants will be recommended to the Bishop for acceptance into the aspirancy period of the formation program.

The formal application process for men interested in becoming aspirants for the Permanent Deacon Formation Class has been scheduled for Saturday, January 28, 2023. Prospective aspirants and their wives are asked to gather at the lower level of The Cathedral of St. Peter, (Undercroft - South Entrance) 200 W. Harrison Street, Belleville, IL 62220 at 10:00 a.m.

Those desiring to be considered **must** complete the formal application and return it to the Vocation Office. Applications must be returned to the Diocesan Vocation Office by March 4, 2023.

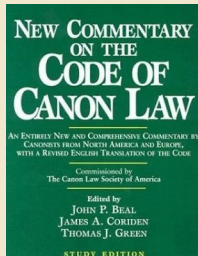

PREPARING FOR DEACON ASPIRANCY, ORDINATION AND REVIEW

Can. 1008^a By divine institution, some of the Christian faithful are marked with an indelible character and constituted as sacred ministers by the sacrament of

holy orders. They are thus consecrated and deputed so that, each according to his own grade, they may serve the People of God by a new and specific title.

Can. 1009 §1. The orders are the episcopate, the presbyterate, and the diaconate.

§2. They are conferred by the imposition of hands and the consecratory prayer which the liturgical books prescribe for the individual grades.

Soon the initial application process for those men seeking to become Permanent Deacons will begin. The application process allows the Formation Committee to gather necessary information that will help with your discernment and readiness to begin the Aspirancy period.

It is suggested that those seeking Aspirancy, those in formation and ordained deacons to review particularly, *The Prerequisites for Ordination and Irregularities and other impediments.*

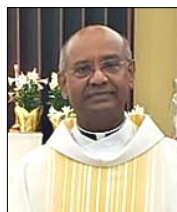
*Constructing Effective Introductions

MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

The “Come and See” program conducted on October 15 in the Cathedral of St. Peter to interview potential candidates for Diaconate ministry in our Diocese of Belleville, witnessed two fundamental truths about vocation and ministries. Eleven candidates participated in the program and most of them were accompanied by their wives. Father Pautler, Deacon Wayne and his wife Josie, Deacon Gary and his wife Kathy, and myself addressed the gathering recalling the way we ourselves received the vocation from the Lord to the Priestly and Diaconate ministries.

In the “question and answer” session, Josie and Kathy spoke and pointed out how their husbands’ vocation and ministry takes precedence and permeates all their existing relationships; they have grown in spirituality, in understanding and intimacy as they serve the Lord together as couples.

The first truth, then, is that Christ the Lord indeed demands absolute loyalty towards Him and transforms all our relationships in order that those whom He calls serves Him alone (Lk.9:51 - 62). The second truth is that there is a cost to pay in one’s ministering the Lord: patience, frustration, anguish, threats, being misunder-

stood and ignored – all these make one’s ministry “complete.” The candidates themselves realized this truth in the light of their own involvement in the parish ministries. I hope and pray that the Lord chooses these candidates with such maturity to serve Him in His Church.
